NATIONAL AWARDS POLICY

GENERAL

In order to recognize deserving service by members of the Association, CPVA has an annual awards system. The awards are in the form of engraved plaques with the CPVA emblem at the top and will state the name of the award, the year of awarding and the name of the recipient.

AWARDS

There are two awards which will be given:

Peacekeeper of the Year Award

This Award will be given to the member who has demonstrated highly notable good work on behalf of the Association during the past year as a volunteer at the national, regional or chapter level. The Peacekeeper of the Year Award will normally be given to one recipient each year but may be given to two if the circumstances warrant it – the decision will be made by the National Executive. The award period for the Peacekeeper of the Year is the period ending 31 March of the year in which the award is to be given

Peacekeeper Builder Award

This Award will be given to the member, or non-member, who has served the CPVA with distinction for a long time and has made a significant contribution to the development and welfare of the Association or veterans in general. The Peacekeeper Builder Award may be given only to one person per year and does not have to be awarded at all if there is no suitable recipient. There is no set date period for the Builder Award

NOMINATIONS AND AWARDING

The recipients of the awards will be decided by the National Executive from the nominations submitted by the Chapters or individual members and will be announced at the Annual General Meeting. In order to be considered, nominations must be received by the CPVA Secretary in writing, with reasonable substantiation for decision making, not later than 9 May of the year of the awarding.

COMING INTO FORCE
